planning baby's checkups

Know when baby will need to see the pediatrician (a lot!), and what will happen when you get there. This is the schedule that the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) recommends for the first two years.

○ AT EVERY APPOINTMENT, STARTING AT BIRTH

Full physical exam: Baby will get a head-to-toe exam at each visit to check reflexes, skin tone, alertness, and hip stability. The doctor will check the shape of baby's head to make sure it's rounding out nicely.

Measurements: Baby's length (later referred to as his height), weight, and head circumference

Development: The doctor will gauge whether baby's development and behaviors are on track.

🔘 3–5 DAYS AFTER BIRTH

Full physical exam: If baby hasn't had a metabolic/hemoglobin screening yet, he will now, so mentally prepare for a blood draw.

Full physical exam

Development screening: The doctor will ask you a series of questions about baby's growth and behavior, and also may ask you to play with your baby to see how he behaves and moves. The intent is to see if your baby is learning basic skills at a normal rate.
